

NDIS Worker Screening



Mandatory

Registered providers

Clearance required for all staff in 'risk assessed' roles

- Direct support workers
- Key personnel (includes **CEO** and Board Members)
- Anyone with more than 'incidental' contact

Phasing-in period WA

Before 1 February 2023

- **NDIS Worker Screening**
- Workers employed before 1 February 2021 with an 'acceptable' check may not need to immediately undertake NDIS Worker Screening. See: www.wa.gov.au/ sites/default/files/2021-07/NDIS-Check-

After 1 February 2023

- New workers need to undertake

 All workers need to undertake **NDIS Worker Screening**



Voluntary

Unregistered providers

People directly hiring their own supports (Plan & Self-Managed)

Working with Children

Anyone in 'child-related work' requires a Working with Children Check (WWCC) in addition to **NDIS Worker Screening**

Screening Check:

Includes criminal history and previous workplace misconduct findings



- Workers are either 'cleared' or 'excluded
- Clearance is national and worker is given a clearance number (not a card)
- Clearance expires after 5 years
- Workers are monitored during the 5-year period
- New information may trigger a reassessment of worker
- Screening done in WA by Department of Communities, NDIS Worker Screening Unit

National Database:

Keeps record of worker clearance status



- Employers are notified of any changes to worker clearance status during the 5-year period
- Database managed nationally by the **NDIS Quality and Safeguards Commission**
- Registered providers access the database through the NDIS Commission Portal using PRODA log in details: www.ndiscommission.gov.au/providers/ ndis-commission-portal
